Youth Camp opening was held on May 19 thru 21. There was about 80 Elk members in attendance. A lot of work got accomplished in three days. The pontoons got water ready, new ramp was built on the dining hall, thirty new bikes got put together, grass got cut, all leaves were picked up and many other projects were completed. The HRS building got the old insulation from the ceiling removed and new blown in, replaced some water damaged sheet rock in the back bedroom.



The main project is the Winona Hopkins Cabin. The Youth Camp Board of Directors approved twenty five thousand dollars for this project. The work on this cabin started in January. Bob Arthur is the project manager. This cabin was completely stripped inside and out. The cabin now has five bedrooms, two bathrooms, kitchen area and sitting area. All new siding was installed. Work on this cabin still continues and hopefully will be completed by fall. A lot of volunteered hours went into this project along with all the volunteered hours for the many projects that need to get done at the camp.

The week of April 17th Krazy Thompson came to camp with forty men from I-falls to take on some projects. A lot of work got done, wood racks were filled, stump grinding, painting, plumbing and rebuilding of the store just to name a few. There is a ladies work week also at the Youth Camp, it was held June 1st thru the 4th. This is headed up by Becky Radika. She recruits a lot of women to come to camp and take on projects also. The Youth Camp Board greatly appreciates all you women do and thanks you for your support.

Veterans and Membership Memorial at Youth Camp

In a joint effort of the Minnesota Elks Veterans Services and the Minnesota Elks Youth Camp, construction of a Memorial, which will honor both our Military Veterans and our Membership, will begin this Fall at the Best Place on Earth head-quarters of Minnesota.

A nine-flagpole memorial, consisting of 6 Military Branch flags, 1 Minnesota State Flag, 1 B.P.O.E. Flag, and a Centralized American Flag/POW flag, will replace the existing flagpole area at Camp. This area will also house the Bull and Doe Elk statues as well as four signs indicating the pillars of Elkdom: Charity; Justice; Brotherly Love; and Fidelity. Each flagpole will have a plaque describing what each of the Flags represent and will be used as an education tool for the youth (and adults) who attend the Camp.

The first stage of the construction project will be the placement of the Flagpoles and Plaques, the block wall, the Elk statues on a landscaped bed of woodchips. Additional plans will consist of replacing the wood chips with paving stones and replacing the retain-

ing block back wall with an area that will offer the virtue of a member's name in Love and Memory to be engraved upon. More details on how members can purchase/donate to receive a memorial brick will be provided at a later date.
