Founded in 1954, the Youth Camp is turning 65. Mark your calendars for October 17 to 20, 2019, and plan to attend. All 6 lodges from the North are busy planning a lot of fun events. If you were there last year, you know what a great time we had. We encourage "Jumping In With Both Feet" and invite you to come back to camp and invite a member to come along that has never experienced the camp.

Meetings will be held at the Breezy Point Conference Center on Friday and Saturday. The Youth Camp Basket Auction will take place in the meeting room, as well as the Youth Camp Drawing on Saturday. Friday will be our day to be at the camp, rain or shine. After the meeting on Friday, you will be on your own for lunch and hope that you patronize some of the local bars and restaurants in the area.
